INTRODUCTION

Citizens Memorial Hospital (CMH) and the Polk County Health Center (PCHC), both in Bolivar, Missouri, collaborated to write a joint Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for 2025-2028.

The process started with a regional collaboration with the Ozarks Health Commission. Hospital systems, local public health agencies (LPHAs) and other health care partners in the greater Ozarks worked together to release a comprehensive Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA).

CMH and PCHC used the results of the CHNA to develop the CHIP. This collaborative process is representative of the broader community's cooperative efforts to address critical health needs and social determinants of health. The CHIP targets areas of health need and disparity in communities and create actionable plans to make them better over time.

CHIP Development Timeline

October 2024

Ozarks Health Commission (hospital systems, local public health agencies and other healthcare partners) meets to plan the CHNA timeline and methodology.

December 2024

Citizens Memorial Hospital (CMH) and Polk County Health Center (PCHC) meet to analyze public health data and Missouri Hospital Association (MHA) data to analyze and cross-examine top issues from each dataset.

January 2025

CMH, PCHC and community partners review data summaries to determine top health outcomes across data sets, identifying the top three areas of focus.

February/March 2025

CMH, PCHC, Community Outreach Ministries (COM), Bolivar Schools and other community partners gather to develop and distribute community partner surveys and community surveys.

April/May 2025

Data from surveys, public health data and MHA data are combined to create the Community Health Needs Assessment.

June 2025


CMH, PCHC and community partners meet to review all data sets and begin to establishing goals, objectives and activities relating to priority areas.

September 2025

Continued work toward CHIP priority areas with partners.

October 2025

Finalized CHIP presented to CMH, PCHC, stakeholders and the community.



ABOUT THE PARTNERS

Citizens Memorial Hospital

Citizens Memorial Hospital is an 86-bed hospital in Bolivar, serving over 70,000 patients a year. CMH also manages 34 clinics, including 14 certified rural health clinics. The Citizens Memorial Health Care Foundation manages seven long-term care facilities, home health and other services. CMH serves eight counties: the five counties in the Bolivar Community and Dallas, Benton and northern Greene counties. CMH's total service area is over 130,000 individuals.



Polk County Health Center

Polk County Health Center is a local public health department located in Bolivar, Missouri serving the citizens of Polk County as well as supporting nearby counties. PCHC staff are dedicated to serving and supporting individuals by providing health care, education, and resources to build a safer and healthier community.



PROGRESS REPORTS

Citizens Memorial Hospital progress: 2022-2025

CMH made significant progress toward goals established in its 2022-2025 CHNA Implementation Plan:

- Began offering Tobacco Cessation classes. (Goal: Reduction in the adult smoking rate.)
- Expanded Addiction Recovery to two more communities. (Goal: Reduction in mortality rates for substance use disorder/opioid use disorder.)
- Continued programs such as the CMH Senior Fitness Center, cardio-pulmonary rehabilitation and community health events. (Goal: Reduction in adult obesity and physical inactivity rates in the service area.)
- Opened the CMH Behavioral Health Transitional Clinic (Goal: Increase in the availability of mental health providers in the service area.)

However, there is still room for improvement through the 2025-2028 CHIP.

Polk County Health Center Progress: 2022-2025

PCHC made advancements toward goals from the CHIP completed in 2023. Actions recognized through CHIP efforts to reach these goals are:

- Implemented a social determinants of health screening with all clients to determine prevention, intervention and treatment of substance abuse. (Goal: Decrease mortality rates from substance use disorder/opioid use disorder in Polk County by 2%.)
- Participation in ToRCH leadership board to expand support for improving population health outcomes. (Goal: Decrease mortality rates from substance use disorder/opioid use disorder in Polk County by 2%.)
- Updated the Resource Guide and expanded connectivity by using the Unite Us platform. (Goal: Decrease mortality rates from substance use disorder/opioid use disorder in Polk County by 2%.)
- Updated Lunch and Learn content for improved engagement and effectiveness of the program to increase awareness and access to mental health resources. (Goal: Increase access to mental health care support services.)
- Promoted healthy lifestyle messaging through social media campaigns to reduce obesity and increase physical activity.
 (Goal: Reduce adult obesity and physical inactivity rates for Polk County by 2%.)

Additional actions continue toward the goals, objectives and activities identified in the CHIP.

PROCESS USED TO DEVELOP THE CHNA

Leadership and data collection

CMH and PCHC staff worked with the Ozarks Health Commission to gather data.

Community Partner Survey

About 79 community partners were invited. Of those, 44 responded. Their feedback shaped the questions asked in the Community Survey.

Community Survey

Shared through CMH, PCHC, local schools and organizations, this survey collected 394 responses from residents in the Bolivar Community.

Public health and Missouri Hospital Association (MHA) data

Public health data helped compare local outcomes with the region, state and nation. MHA data showed diagnoses from clinics and hospitals across the five-county area.

Review and analysis

Partners reviewed the data to see which health issues appeared across sources. In January 2025, local partners selected three priority health issues and then began creating a Community Health Improvement Plan.

IDENTIFIED PRIORITY HEALTH ISSUES

Three health areas emerged as the top priorities for the Bolivar Community:

Chronic disease

Chronic conditions are long-lasting illnesses that need ongoing care. Key concerns include heart disease, diabetes and cancer. Smoking, poor diet, lack of exercise and alcohol use contribute to these problems. Many residents living in poverty face extra challenges in managing these conditions.

Mental health

Mental health affects, and is affected by, physical health. Adults report high levels of poor mental health. Youth face long wait times and limited access to therapy. Behavioral and anxiety disorders are higher here than in the region, though lower than at the state level. Poverty and lack of providers make access even harder.

Access to care

Access issues were common across all data sources. People face high costs for insurance, health care and healthy food. Provider shortages, especially in primary care, dental, mental health and addiction treatment, are serious. Travel, work schedules, motivation and low energy also reduce access to healthy options.

COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CHIP)

Citizens Memorial Hospital and Polk County Health Center staff collaborated with other community partners to develop a Community Health Improvement Plan.

As leaders in the local healthcare community, CMH and PCHC are the most significant contributors to the CHIP. However, collaboration with other community partners is necessary to ensure all segments of the population will be positively impacted by the objectives and activities identified and implemented in the CHIP.
